Last night, the President signed the combination spending bill and COVID-19 relief package passed last week by Congress. Below is a summary of utility assistance-related funding of note.

Included in the spending bill:

 \$3.75 billion for the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) for FY21

Included in the COVID-19 relief funding:

- \$25 billion for an Emergency Rental Assistance Program that also allows
 payment for utility bills and arrearages for renters. The program will be
 administered by state and local government agencies with territories and
 tribes also receiving a portion of reserved funds
- \$638 million for a Low-Income Household Drinking Water and
 Wastewater Emergency Assistance Program, considered a victory for
 water utility assistance advocates as the first federal water assistance
 legislation of its kind and magnitude. The funding is administered by the
 U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, which also administers
 LIHEAP, and will be used to pay water and wastewater bills for eligible
 households. The program provides grants to states and tribes, which in turn

Because no specific funding was appropriated for LIHEAP in the relief portion of the bill, it is imperative that your organization act now to support the program as we approach a new year, new administration, and new Congress. NEUAC continues to support additional funding of at least \$4.5 billion to address the pandemic-related utility needs of households, while acknowledging the National Energy Assistance Directors' Association (NEADA) assertion that the need is in excess of \$10 billion for LIHEAP to address the utility crisis triggered by the economic repercussions of COVID-19.

Expansion of eligibility could be considered by Congress in future relief bills in order to assist households with utility needs beyond the scope of the traditional LIHEAP households.

NEUAC will continue to keep you informed on progress of utility assistance legislation as information becomes available.
